EMV Chip Cards and what it means to Exhibitors

As the US changes to EMV Chip Technology for Credit Cards, the liability for card fraud has shifted to whichever party is the least EMV-compliant in certain fraudulent transactions. What this means to our Exhibitors is that if you do not have a chip card reader and you process a fraudulent card, you will be the one who has to "eat" the charge. How do you avoid this? Make sure you get a chip card reader from your bank, Square or whoever you process your credit cards through. If you use Square and have pre-ordered a chip card reader, they will take the liability for you until your order is complete.

Palm Trees, Story Telling, and Cookies -- Oh my!

If you missed September's meeting, you missed a good time. Bob Ballantyne took us on an amazing trip to Key West. Bob & Nancy even had palm trees and refreshments for us. Nancy has been kind enough to share her wonderful recipe with us.

Key Lime Cookies

½ cup unsalted butter

1 t baking powder

1 cup white sugar

½ t salt

2 eggs

¼ cup Key Lime juice (Redner's sells "Nellie & Joe's Famous Key West Lime Juice" in a yellow 16 oz. bottle)

1 ¾ cup all purpose flour

zest of 1 lime

½ cup confectioners' sugar for dusting on baked cookies

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
2. Cream butter, sugar and eggs until smooth. Add lime juice and zest.
3. Combine flour, baking powder and salt, blend into creamed mixture.
4. Line baking pans with parchment paper and drop batter by teaspoon – smaller is nicer. Batter will spread out as it bakes.
5. Bake 15 minutes – don't let cookies get too browned.
6. Sift confectioners' sugar onto warm cookies.
7. Make a cup of tea and enjoy!

Pennsylvania German Cultural Heritage Center

Christmas on the Farm is just around the corner, only 9 weeks away, Saturday, December 5, 2015. The location is the PA German Cultural Heritage Center, part of Kutztown University.

For those who are not familiar with the "Heritage Center", it is located at the end of Luckenbill Road, in Kutztown, where our Reading-Berks Chapter has a log cabin. Through our partnership with PGCHC, we are able to hold our Spring and Holiday Shows at the Kutztown University Field House. There are three annual events hosted by PGCHC, Easter on the Farm which is held the day before Palm Sunday, Heemet Fescht held the last Saturday of September, and Christmas on the Farm that is held the first Saturday of December. Each event is from 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM.

No fee is charged for juried chapter members to set up a display in the log cabin, however, PGCHC requests a 15% commission on items sold. The log cabin can comfortably accommodate 4 artisans, plus there are other locations on the farmstead, including the farmhouse, that you could set up a display. We can count on Barry Bennecoff to display his furniture and accessories within the log cabin. Barry allows others to display their work on his furniture and accessories, plus there is plenty of space to hang things on the walls. Matt and Elaine Vardjan usually have their wares displayed in the alcove of the cabin. At least two more artisans could display their work. If you are interested, call Amanda Richardson at 610-683-1589 at PGCHC to reserve your space.

Ray and Pat Oxenford are usually in the other log cabin which is set up as a tinshop and also temporarily houses the hand tools used on the farm. Ray also brings along some of his own tools to use to demonstrate the art of tinsmithing at these events.

We look forward to the Belsnickel visiting us at Christmas on the Farm, hoping all girls and boys have been good this year. There will be Carolers strolling the farmstead, and the Plow Boys organization always has a delicious menu of PA Dutch foods for purchase ... soups, chili, chicken potpie, barbeque, hamburgers, hot dogs, great desserts and beverages. And, if there is a few snow flurries, it really gets you in the mood for Christmas.

Hope we can count on you to be part of this great partnership offered to our chapter members by Kutztown University's PA German Cultural Heritage Center. If you have questions about these events please do not hesitate to contact me (Pat Oxenford at 610-385-3431).
